Seed to Supper: A Visit to the Annadana Farm

A one-day visit to Annadana - a seed conservation centre and organic farm was arranged for the students of Christ Junior College on 16 June 2023 by the Department of English. A refreshing earthy aroma filled the air, intermingling with the subtle fragrance of the diverse flora. Ms Sangeeta Sharma, the Chairperson and Trustee of Annadana spoke to the students about her journey as an agriculture enthusiast. The harsh realities of genetically modified foods were exposed. The farm follows permaculture principles with their focus on biodiversity and natural ecosystem balance. Students were introduced to a variety of sustainable farming techniques used by them, like a unique rainwater harvesting system that generates extremely fertile topsoil, intercropping, soil regeneration and conservation of indigenous varieties of seeds (seed banks). The students learnt the right methods to save and plant a seed and were offered a unique farm to table experience allowing them to savour the freshest produce while feasting on a mango and passion fruit drink. This visit helped them realise that beyond being a source of sustenance, farms play a pivotal role in preserving biodiversity and maintaining ecological balance. They are the guardians of our food security and represent the perseverance of rural communities. This farm visit was more than just a scenic getaway; it deepened the understanding of the interdependence between humanity and agriculture.

A visit to the Gandhi Krishi Vigyana Kendra

On 25 July 2023, the students of Christ Junior College embarked on an educational field trip to GKVK (Gandhi Krishi Vigyana Kendra), an agricultural farm situated in Yashoda Nagar, Yelahanka. By the initiative of the Science Forum, two students from each science class along with the students of the Science Forum were taken on this educational expedition. The purpose of the trip was to provide students with practical insights into modern farming practices, sustainability in agriculture, and the significance of agriculture in our daily lives. The trip was organised as a part of the college's curriculum to promote holistic learning.

The entomology department allowed students to learn about insects, their preservation, the evolution of insects, Forensic Entomology, the exoskeleton of insects, insect reproduction, and different habitats of insects. Students moved towards the sericulture department where the types of silkworms, the specimens of cocoons, the life cycle of a cocoon, and the uses of the leftovers after silk production, and the various producers of silk in Karnataka was taught to the students. At the Department of Forest and Horticulture students were educated about different types of plants and their uses, as well as different types of aromatics, medicinal, and ornamental plants.

Students got the chance to smell and taste various specimens. The Meteorological Department marked the end of the field visit, where students learned about the different instruments used for checking weather conditions and calculating temperature, rain, and wind factors. They learned how to improve and help farmers in their daily life. The field trip to GKVK was an enriching and eye-opening experience for the students. This trip undoubtedly expanded students' knowledge and increased their appreciation for agriculture and farming.

Jhalak Sharma of I PCME G won 2 Bronze Medals at the State Taekwondo Championship held on 15 and 16 July 2023.

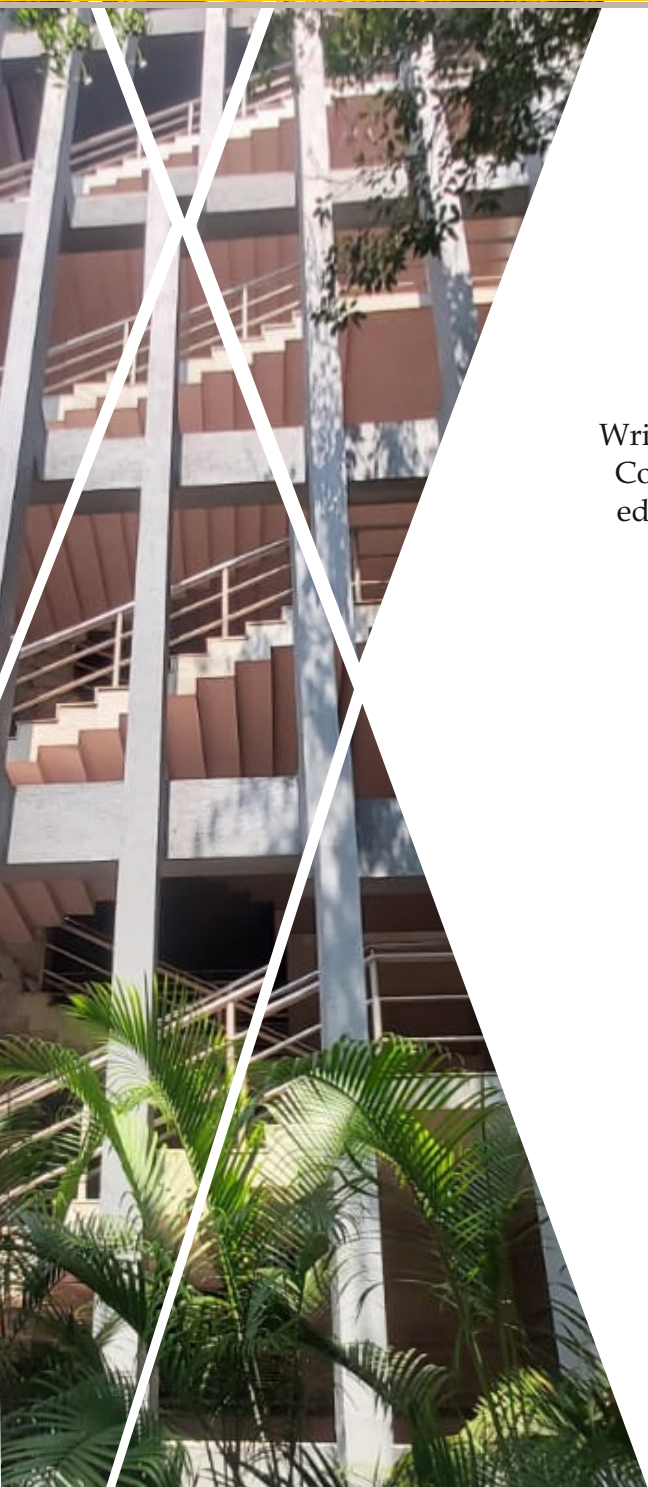
